Codgers 2013

The 'Codgers' is a group of predominantly retired Sussex ringers formed about 15 years ago by George Francis from Warnham. They meet on the first Wednesday of the month and usually ring at two towers (anywhere in Sussex and sometimes over into the adjacent counties) with a leisurely lunch in-between. It is also a social occasion where you can easily mix with ringers from the whole county and beyond unlike District meetings. Codgers can be a way of advancing your ringing as we cover a wide range of methods from Plain Bob Doubles to Bristol.
