A Vision for SCACR update (from the website)

The eight discussion groups held across the Association are now complete and thank you to the local ringers for making the venue arrangements.

Also, thank you to the 142 ringers from 69 different towers who came along to the groups to meet with us and to those of you who have sent comments via email. We very much appreciate your time and contributions.

It has certainly been a valuable opportunity to meet with so many of you across the County and to hear your views on the current state of ringing in Sussex and how this could be developed into the future.

The ideas, comments, suggestions, views were considered by the working group on 31 July and a Special General Committee meeting takes place on Friday 13 September where a formal presentation will be made to officers and divisional representatives. Contact your divisional secretary for details.

It is hoped that further information will be circulated to members as soon as possible after this meeting.

NEW FUNDING allocated to support the installation of training equipment in Sussex.

At the March General Committee Meeting, the Trustees agreed that a sum of £8000 be allocated towards helping towers in Sussex to install their own simulator and training equipment such as dumb-bells.

The money comes from a legacy left to the Association by Bryan Burrough (who learnt to ring at Itchingfield in the 1950s and latterly rang at St Leonards) who died in 2006. It was his wish that his legacy be used for the advancement of ringing in Sussex and it is hoped that by offering some financial support, a wide mix of towers in all corners of the county might consider installing additional equipment.
