The Bells of St Mary's, Balcombe by John Moore

A good and true quarter peal of Grandsire Triples was rung at St Mary's church Balcombe on the afternoon of Sunday 12th January 2014 by ringers from Balcombe and neighbouring towers to mark the start of a fairly major overhaul of the bells and their fittings by Whitechapel Bell Foundry on the following day.

This all began when a clapper fell out of a bell in 2010. Whitechapel were invited to inspect the bells & fittings and provide a report. The intervening period has seen the necessary funding for the work (around £11,000) being raised by organisations, ringers and others in Balcombe, together with a generous donation from the Sussex ringers Bell Restoration Fund and, of course, St Mary's church itself. The bells were out of action for about five weeks and should be back in action about the time you read this article.

The dedication for the quarter peal will be for the start of the work and also as compliment to Mr & Mrs Richard Greenwood and Mr & Mrs Michael Dutton, both of whom celebrated their Diamond wedding anniversaries on the same day this summer. The ringers were:

Warnham's Invitation to Ring at Westminster Abbey

Whilst many residents of Warnham were waking, and perhaps regretting the excesses of New Year's Eve, St Margaret's bell ringers were making their way to London to help herald in the New Year. We had been invited to ring at Westminster Abbey!

It has for some years been the custom of the Westminster Abbey Company of Ringers to invite a visiting band to ring at the Abbey on New Year's Day, which is one of their regular ringing days. One of our band, Simon Alford, is a regular ringer at the Abbey and hence we were honoured with the invitation. Over 20 of us travelled by train to London and we arrived in a very wet, grey capital.



The Abbey was busy with visitors, but we were given preferential treatment from the word go, being able to use the facilities offered to all employees at the Abbey. Up the stone spiral stairs of the North-West tower and into the ringing chamber. Compared to our ringing chamber it was very spacious, but similar with its ring of ten bells.

We had been met by Officers of the Company and they made us very welcome, putting our younger members at ease. Chris Rogers, Secretary of the Company, gave us a brief, but interesting, talk about the history of the bells and their role. They are rung for major church festivals and special services, on the anniversaries of the Queen's accession, coronation and wedding, and on other notable occasions such as the Queen's Official Birthday and Commonwealth Day. It is traditional to ring the bells at the conclusion of a service, but when the sovereign is attending the bells are rung beforehand as well. On anniversaries and festivals the bells are normally rung at one o'clock in the afternoon.



The striking of Big Ben at one o'clock was our cue to 'pull off'. Although a great deal heavier than those at St Margaret's, the Abbey bells were a pleasure to ring. We rang some call changes and a short touch of Grandsire Caters before the group split. Ten of our ringers rang a quarter peal of Grandsire Caters whilst the rest of us were treated to a whirlwind tour of the Abbey by Jeremy Pratt, Deputy Conductor of the Company. It might have been a hurried tour but how fantastic to be allowed into parts of the building that the public were generally prohibited from. To see, at

very close quarters, the craft work on the tomb of Edward the Confessor was certainly a highlight.

The quarter peal was successful, we reassembled and emerged out on to the wet streets of Westminster at 2.30pm. The youngsters had chosen to see the remnants of the New Year's Day parade instead of the Abbey tour. They returned happy, but very wet.

Jeremy Pratt congratulated the band on our ringing, but he especially noted how well the youngsters had handled the bells. I think that this praise should also be directed at the fantastic help and guidance given by their mentors back in St Margaret's.

After the Abbey, we moved on to St. Margaret's, Westminster. This is the 'parish church' for the Palace of Westminster. This was not such a pleasant ringing experience, with some of our band referring to the bells as 'buckets' due to the poor internal acoustics; outside they sound grand.

Our final ring was at St James Garlickhythe, which we enjoyed, even though we were a little tightly packed. These bells were the ones that many of you would have seen being rung on a barge as it sailed down the River Thames in celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. Our day was a fantastic start to the New Year.

Even the weather could not dampen our spirits as we headed home to Warnham.






































Northern Division ADM at Crawley - Saturday 1st February 2014


