St Mary's, Balcombe

The bells of St Mary's are ringing again! Work was finally completed on Monday 17th March when Whitechapel returned with the headstock from the third bell in the ring of eight and fitted it, thus completing the work. This had held things up a bit when it was discovered that this headstock had a loose gudgeon pin



(these stick out of the ends of the headstock and allow the bell to swing). The main bearings are mounted on the gudgeon pin and these proved difficult to remove, but were due for replacement. In the event, the Bluebell Railway came to the rescue and got the bearings off in their heavy engineering workshop at Sheffield Park, but could not replace the gudgeon itself, so new ones had to made and fitted to the headstock at Whitechapel.

Thanks go to Steve Check at the Bluebell Railway for their help, also, in no small way, to the Sussex Ringers Bell Restoration Fund helpers, Graham Hills (Goring), Mike Cattell (Horsham) and David Cragg (Ditchling) who gave up a whole week to help with the work and keep the costs down, not to mention Alan Seymour of Burgess Hill, who helped when the headstock came back and also came back a week later to help with adjusting the ropes. You'll also be pleased to hear that our appeal for people to come forward and learn to ring has been heeded by one lady, new to Balcombe, who is now learning to ring. On or two more would be good! We practise from 7.30pm-9pm every Tuesday.
