Safeguarding Update from Pat Aylward 6th March 2016

Hurray! I hear you say, just what we want to know about!

Some towers and ringers really appreciate the importance of safeguarding children and vulnerable adults. And some are not so interested. Too frequently I hear 'we haven't got any children at our tower' 'their parents are teaching them' 'I've worked with children for years and not needed a DBS check' 'big brother' 'just another piece of paper, it doesn't mean anything' Unfortunately, in the society in which we live these days safeguarding children is something everyone must take seriously. And, as SCACR Safeguarding officer, it's my responsibility to remind you of this.

In January this year the Central Council of Church Bell ringers issued a general statement on Safeguarding Children in Towers. www.cccbr.org.uk You should have a copy in your ringing chamber. If not, and you are not able to access the web site to print one, please contact me to send you a copy. 01273 812577

Anyone who regularly teaches, trains or supervises children must have a DBS check done by the parish safeguarding officer. This is usually a member of the PCC. It is most commonly the Tower Captain who does the teaching, but not necessarily so ringers in general supporting roles or one off teaching or deputising do not need DBS checks.

DBS checks can be automatically updated or renewed every 5 years. If you are the person DBS checked and responsible for safeguarding in your tower you must attend a Diocesan training update session every 3 years.

So much of safeguarding is really just good practice; obtain parental consent to teach children; 2 adults when children are present (preferably one male, one female). Towers are also advised to keep an attendance register, just so you can look back to see who was present at any ringing occasion. I have trouble remembering who was at ringing this morning, let alone last week or last month or last year.



Ringing exhibition: including books from SCACR library; St Mary's parish church (Friday 8th to Monday 11th April, 10 am to 5.30 pm).


